Graham's passionate voice continues to be heard in support of peace, positive, social and environmental justice. The No Nukes/Musicians United for Safe Energy (MUSE) concerts he organized with Jackson Browne and Bonnie Raitt in 1979 remain seminal benefit events. In 2011, Nash was instrumental in bringing MUSE back to the forefront with a concert to benefit Japan disaster relief and groups promoting non-nuclear energy worldwide.

In September 2013, Nash released his long-awaited autobiography Wild Tales, which provides a mesmorizing, no-holds-barred look through time at this remarkable career and the music that helped change a generation and a culture. It landed him on the New York Times Best Sellers list, and will be released in paperback format this fall.

He is currently working on a new studio record, due out early 2016.
